

Job Description: IFCA Officer

Job Title:	Inshore Fisheries and Conservation Officer

Kent & Essex Inshore Fisheries and Conservation Authority (IFCA) is seeking a dedicated and motivated Inshore Fisheries and Conservation Officer to support the management and conservation of inshore fisheries within the Kent and Essex coastal areas. This role involves a combination of regulatory enforcement, conservation efforts and stakeholder engagement.

Purpose of the Job:

The role covers duties both at sea and on land, working as part of a small team on a survey/patrol vessel as a member of the crew, undertaking boarding operations of fishing vessels and undertaking shore-based enforcement of fisheries legislation, as well as assisting with surveys and project work. These duties would be carried out across both Kent and Essex, as well as occasionally outside the district.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. To undertake the duties of crew on the Authority's Fisheries Patrol/Survey Vessels and help maintain the vessels in good working order.
- 2. To assist in the operation of the Rigid Inflatable Boat (RIB) and take part in the boarding of fishing vessels at sea, under the instructions of the Skipper of the vessel.
- 3. Monitor compliance with fisheries regulations, enforce fishing and conservation legislation, and conduct inspections on vessels, gear, and catch to ensure adherence. This will involve both sea-based and shore-based inspections.

- 4. Under the direction of the Lead Compliance Officer to assist with the planning of patrol activity and enforcement planning on both shore and sea.
- 5. To liaise with the fishing industry and other key stakeholders, regarding fisheries/ conservation management and associated issues to foster positive relationships, address concerns, and promote understanding of conservation measures.
- 6. To assist with the undertaking of stock surveys, habitat assessments and research projects.
- 7. To respond to enquiries and prepare correspondence.
- 8. To attend, on request, meetings with other bodies as a representative of the Chief IFC Officer or Authority.
- 9. Undertake such tasks that the Chief IFC Officer or Authority may require.
